AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS

- GTU is accredited with **A+ Grade by NAAC** in its very first cycle.
- Graduate School of Pharmacy secured a **71st rank in all over India in the prestigious National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)** in Pharmacy discipline.
- PG - Computer Engineering (Cyber Security) course offered by Graduate School of Engineering and Technology (GSET) is accredited by '**National Board of Accreditation (NBA)**' from the A.Y. 2023 to 2026.

DEGREE / DIPLOMA / PH.D. TO BE CONFERRED IN 13TH CONVOCAION

- I congratulate all **48,575 students** and **146 gold medal winners** who will receive degrees at this Convocation.
- Every year a gold medal is also given to one of the Startups incubated at GTU to strengthen entrepreneurship.
- In this Convocation, **28,665 UG degrees** will be awarded. 23,883 undergraduate students in Engineering, 3089 undergraduate students in Pharmacy and 1693 undergraduate students in other disciplines (B.B.A., B.C.A., B.Arch., B.H.M., B.I.D., B.Voc., B.Tech., B.Tech. -PDDC) will get the degrees.
- **5103 Masters degrees** will be awarded. 461 students of Master of Engineering, 654 students of Master of Pharmacy and 3988 students of other disciplines (M. Arch., MBA, MCA, M.Sc., M. Tech.) will get the degrees.
- **51 Doctoral degrees and 14,452 Diploma** will be awarded.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO PROMOTE RESEARCH

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of GTU has initiated schemes to promote research culture among faculty members. Following grants have been released in the A. Y. 2022-23 –

- **Seed Money Scheme (SMS):** Rs. 15, 81,320/- were approved by the University as Seed Money grant facilitating 14 teachers and 11 students of GTU Schools.
- **Financial Assistance Scheme for Teachers (FAST):** Rs. 1, 80,957/- was disbursed as financial assistance to 23 teachers.

- **Staff Recognition Scheme (SRS):** 19 staff members were benefited by the scheme and Rs. 1,15,000/- was disbursed as a financial reward to them.
- **Administrative Staff Appreciation Policy (ASAP):** In the F.Y. 2022-23, 07 sections were awarded as Best Section and 12 employees were awarded as Best Employee under the scheme and Rs. 1,30,000/- disbursed as a financial reward to them.
- **Research Promotion Scheme for Affiliated Colleges to Conduct Minor Research Projects (RPS-MRP) -** Total sanctioned grant to affiliated institutes was Rs.10,56,000/- for conducting minor research projects.

ACADEMIC FRAMEWORK

- GTU offers Bachelor of Engineering (BE) in 54 branches out of which 11 branches are in emerging areas like Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Machine Learning, VLSI, EVs etc.
- Professional core courses have 30% weightage while approximately 15% are basic Science courses.
- Project work, seminar and internship in industry has nearly 10% weightage in overall credits system for BE. Computer Engineering, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Information Technology and Electrical Engineering were the top branches in which 19425 students completed their internship projects this year.
- Apart from this, more than 22 % courses have elective options for the students to choose the courses as per their choice.
- Adoption and implementation of Minor/Honours Degrees in the A.Y. 2021-22 from Semester 4 to 7 of BE under Value Added Courses to provide flexibility to students to achieve the additional qualification while completing their current academic program. Presently 16 institutes offer 20 branches of Minor courses to 1622 students.
- The curriculum of Master of Engineering is framed based on the 'UGC framework for post-graduate programs' which incorporates the essence of NEP 2020 and National Credit Framework (NCrF). GTU offers Master of Engineering (ME) in 87 branches.
- Dissertation and Electives have nearly 32% weightage each in overall credits of ME.
- GTU runs Centre for Continuing Education (CCE) in which more than 2800 beneficiaries have earned certificates under the domains of Pharmacy, Tourism & Hospitality, Computer Science, Multidisciplinary, Electrical Engineering, Solar and Electrical Engineering, Business Administration, Sports, Mathematics, Mechanical & Civil Engineering, Civil Engineering and Manufacturing Technology.
- GTU Alumni are working in prestigious organizations in various sectors of Engineering, Operations, Business Development, Information Technology and Services.

INITIATIVES TOWARDS IMPLEMENTATION OF NEP-2020

GTU has taken proactive steps to implement the NEP 2020 -

- **Curriculum & Pedagogy:** University is regularly revising and updating the syllabi of courses by including Communication and Social Science, Engineering Science, Project work, Personality Development (Value Education), Professional Electives, Open Electives and Internship etc. The emphasis is on relevant, updated, and engaging curriculum, supported by quality teaching practices. Continuous formative assessment has been implemented to ensure learning improvement and practical application. University also promotes student wellness through fitness, good health, psycho-social well-being, and ethical grounding which is vital for quality education.
- **Vocational Education Integration:** Vocational education offers skill enhancement. GTU has promoted vocational courses in various bachelor's and diploma programs to meet industry needs.
- **Policy to incorporate Working Professionals to up-skill their career by joining the Degree and Diploma Engineering Programs:** This initiative helps individuals by gaining industry/field experience while completing their studies. Rules for Working Professionals are framed for B.E./B.Tech. and Diploma Engineering programs based on the AICTE guidelines.

- GTU has adopted **Policy on Academic Bank of Credits** of every enrolled student, to get the benefit of credits accumulation and transfer for achieving flexibility for various disciplines at Diploma, Undergraduate and Postgraduate levels.
- **Adoption of Contributor Personality Development Program (CPDP) and Integrated Personality Development Course (IPDC)** in the Diploma and Bachelor of Engineering programs for the overall development of the students.
- Implementation of IIT External Students' program in Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Chemical and Computer Engineering branches of Bachelor of Engineering, where students will get a chance to study the whole semester at IIT Gandhinagar.
- Inclusion of Design Engineering courses in Bachelor of Engineering to develop Design thinking to solve real life problems.
- **UG / Diploma Book Translation in Gujarati Language:** AICTE has allocated the task of translating the books of UG and Diploma Engineering in Gujarati language to GTU under the scheme of offering technical books in regional languages. 20 translated books of 1st year UG and Diploma Engineering, developed under the AICTE Technical Book Writing Scheme, were released by **Prof. T. G. Sitharam, Hon'ble Chairman, All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE)** on the occasion of 16th Foundation Day of the university on 16th May 2023. Presently translation of 42 UG and 46 Diploma Engineering books of second year is ongoing with the support of 176 translators and reviewers.
- **School of Indian Knowledge System (IKS) & Dharohar – Center for IKS:** School of IKS has been established in 2022 and 'MA in Hindu Studies', a two-year Post Graduation Degree Programme, is presently offered. 35 students have registered from various parts of the country and are studying 16 core subjects and 8 projects of IKS.
- Dharohar Center is recognized as a '**Bhasha Kendra**' by IKS Division, AICTE, New Delhi and has been sanctioned a grant of Rs. 9, 45000/- for various academic activities.
- Dharohar Center also received **State Government grant of 15, 00,000/-** for translation and creating E-Content in Gujarati on IKS topics.

PH.D. PROGRAM

- From the initiation of the doctoral studies at the University, **528 Ph.D. degrees** have been awarded till November 2023.
- Presently the University is offering doctoral studies in **22 disciplines**.
- Post-Doctoral Fellowship Programme (PDF) has also been initiated at GTU.
- GTU offers fellowship to 22 Ph.D. students.
- Presently the University has **643 recognized supervisors**.
- 100 research scholars have received doctoral degrees till mid-December, 2023 and have published **277 peer reviewed papers** in UGC Care, SCOPUS and Web of Science indexed journals. Research scholars have also filed **11 Indian and 2 international patents**.
- The University has instituted **SPRIHA IPR – Chair Professor** established under Scheme for Pedagogy and Research in IPRs by Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India.
- **Research Centres of the University:** Department of Pharmaceutical Science (spz. in Pharmaceutics) at Anand Pharmacy College, Anand is recognized as a Research Centre of the University under Faculty of Pharmacy and Gujarat Biotechnology Research Centre (GBRC), Gandhinagar is recognized as a Research Centre of the University under Faculty of Applied Science for Biotechnology.

INTERNATIONALIZATION & COLLABORATIONS

International Experience Program 2023: 87 students of Engineering, Pharmacy & MBA participated in IEP 2023. GTU sponsored the academic cost of teaching for all students. IEP was organized at Laurentian University, Canada for BE CE/IT/ICT/IT & Pharmacy students. BE Mechanical students visited University of Wismar, Germany & MBA students visited Varna University of Management, Bulgaria for IEP.

Enrollment of Foreign Students in 2023: In the current academic year GTU has received more than 2500 applications through ICCR for admission into various courses offered by GTU. Out of these applications, 112 foreign students from 27 countries have been given admission in A. Y. 2023-24 at various affiliated institutes of GTU & GTU Schools.

Interaction with Foreign Universities/Delegations: For exploring the collaborative opportunities with GTU, Dept. of International Relations hosted delegation from various foreign universities like:

- ECAM LaSalle School of Engineering, Lyon, France
- South Dakota State University, USA, Engineering Institute of Technology, Australia
- University of Wollongong, Australia
- University of Technology, Sydney, Australia
- Limkokwing University, Malaysia

Representation of Higher Education of Gujarat as a part of Vibrant Gujarat Delegation to Australia and Singapore: To promote the investment and collaboration opportunities under Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit 2024, one of the delegations led by Additional Chief Secretary, Labour, Skill Development and Employment Department visited Singapore and Australia during October-November 2023. Vice Chancellor GTU represented the higher education of Gujarat in the various roadshows and educational round table meetings at both countries.

MoUs: In 2023, GTU signed 20 MoUs with various prestigious institutes, industries and international organizations to explore new avenues of collaborations.

STARTUP AND ENTREPRENEURIAL ECOSYSTEM

- GTU Innovation and Start-up Centre encourages incubation & innovation amongst the GTU student's fraternity. **115 Start-ups are registered** under DIPP/DPIIT and **700 Start-ups are supported** by GTU GISC.
- **16 crore of Start-up grant** has been given and **total revenue generated is 47 crores.**
- GTU-GISC incubated Start-ups generated 3000+ employment in 2023-24.
- GTU-GISC incubated Start-up **Paathshala** raised a series -A funding round of 20 lakhs at a valuation of 5 Crore.
- GTU-GISC incubated startup **Mr. Ujjal Shah, founder of Mr. Engineer**, has designed a product to assist physically challenged individuals, a next generation electric vehicle solution aimed at promoting Atmanirbhar. Gujarat Police may purchase these products from the CSR Fund to support disabled police officers who have lost limbs in the line of duty.
- GTU AIC-GISC incubated start-ups (Milibolt HealthTech Pvt. Ltd. And Billioncarbon Solutions Pvt. Ltd.) received 2.5 lakhs grant from Start-up Srujan Seed Support.
- GTU AIC GISC incubated startup **Decipher DNA** received funding assistance of Rs 25 lakhs for the scheme of assistance for Startup/innovation policy 2020 by SLEC, NIC GOG.

GTU POST GRADUATE DEPARTMENTS

(i) Graduate School of Engineering & Technology (GSET)

- GSMS has admitted 126 professionals in the International Business, Hospital Management, and Digital Marketing programs in the academic year 2023-24
- 9 international students from 6 different countries have enrolled at GSMS in the A. Y. 2023-24
- Publications by faculty members in SCOPUS/UGC-Care journals during the last year were 12. They also participated/presented papers at 20 national and international conferences/seminars.

(ii) Graduate School of Management Studies (GSMS)

- GSMS has admitted 126 professionals in the International Business, Hospital Management, and Digital Marketing programs in the academic year 2023-24
- 9 international students from 6 different countries have enrolled at GSMS in the A. Y. 2023-24.
- Publications by faculty members in SCOPUS/UGC-Care journals during the last year were 12. They also participated/presented papers at 20 national and international conferences/seminars.

(iii) Graduate School of Pharmacy (GSP)

- Graduate School of Pharmacy has been appreciated as one of the Best-performing National Digital Library of India (NDLI) Clubs in Gujarat State.
- Faculty members published 12 book chapters, reviewed and published 13 research papers, received 3 patents and 4 awards.
- Two professors of GSP visited Copenhagen Business School, Denmark and Seoul, South Korea to do the short-term courses.
- GTU - Public Testing Laboratory in collaboration with the Quality Council of India conducted a training program on Laboratory Systems & Internal Audit as per ISO/IEC 17025:2017 for 35 participants from different pharma industries, research laboratories, management companies, agriculture industries and chemical industries

(iv) School of Applied Sciences & Technology (SAST)

- SAST received 2 extramural major research grants (67 Lakhs and 45 Lakhs, respectively) and 9 minor research grants.
- SAST faculties and Ph.D. Scholars published 20 research papers in reputed international peer-reviewed journals, including those in high impact journals of Frontiers, Springer and Elsevier. The papers reached a wide-audience globally last year with more than 680 citations in the year 2023.
- In the innovations sector, two patents were granted in the field of biomedical technologies.
- SAST conducted 5 hands-on training on animal cell culture, bioinformatics and molecular biology, medical devices; additionally, 2 collaborative training sessions were conducted under the on-going MoU with Gujarat Biotechnology Research Centre (GBRC) Gandhinagar.

(v) Gujarat Power Engineering and Research Institute (GPRI):

- Gujarat Power Engineering and Research Institute started offering Diploma Engineering in (Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Computer Engineering, Mechanical Engineering) from 2023-24.
- Industry Academia Conclave was organized on 4th March, 2023. The meeting was attended by more than 50 entrepreneurs, industrialists, representatives from GWSSB, Railways, ONGC and R&B.
- Faculty members published 09 research papers in peer reviewed journals and have obtained 05 Indian patents.

Ranking:

- L.M. College of Pharmacy secured 58th rank & Graduate School of Pharmacy, GTU secured 71st rank in NIRF India Rankings 2023 - Pharmacy.

Accreditation:

- Shree Dhanvantary Pharmacy College, Birla Vishvakarma Mahavidyalaya, L.M. College of Pharmacy, Anand Pharmacy College and Smt. Champaben Vasantbhai Gajera Pharmacy Mahila College i.e. total five affiliated institutes are accredited by NAAC valid score.
- Total 37 affiliated institutes are accredited by NBA in a total of 86 courses.

Autonomous:

- Birla Vishvakarma Mahavidyalaya' and 'Shree Dhanvantary Pharmacy College' are given Autonomous Status by UGC.

Placements:

- For Academic Year 2023-24, more than 4000 students from various affiliated institutes have been placed in various organizations.

INTERNSHIPS, PLACEMENT AND INDUSTRY COLLABORATION

Recruitment Drives:

- In 2023, Integrated Training and Placement Cell (ITAP) of GTU executed various recruitment drives for students. A total of 97 companies participated, and 600 vacancies were floated to institutes from Jan – Dec. 2023.

Internship Drives:

- In 2023, ITAP- GTU conducted Internship drives for students where 670 students were placed in internships with reputed organizations like IBM directly by GTU.

Centre for Career Counselling and Advancements (CCCA) under ITAP:

- CCCA organizes guidance sessions for aspirants preparing for Gujarat Public Service Commission (GPSC) general administration.
- During the training programs experts from GTU and from the respective domains provided guidance on various aspects like State Profile, Current Affairs, GPSC expectations from students, Communication Skills Situational based questions, Students Group activity Roles & responsibilities of Officers to GPSC aspirants.

SPORTS, CULTURAL AND G-20 ACTIVITIES

- 'Mass Surya Namaskar and World Yoga Day Protocol Training Program' was organized by the Sports and NSS teams of GTU on 17th June 2023.
- Drug Free India Campaign was jointly organized by Gujarat Technological University, Department of Education, Government of Gujarat and Art of Living on 15th March 2023. The distinguished guests were Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar; Shri Balvantsinh Rajput, Hon'ble Cabinet Minister; Shri Harsh Sanghvi, Hon'ble Minister of State and approx. 40 Gujarati artists.
- GTU organized State level Start-up Fest 2023 with Sneh-Shilp Foundation.

- GTU actively engaged in the **G-20** initiatives through '**University Connect.**' Proactive measures were taken to integrate the G-20 agenda wherein various departments and affiliated institutes enthusiastically participated in a series of activities aligned with the identified themes.

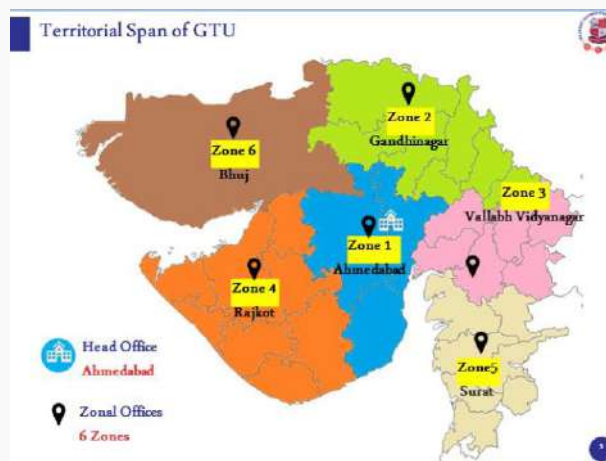

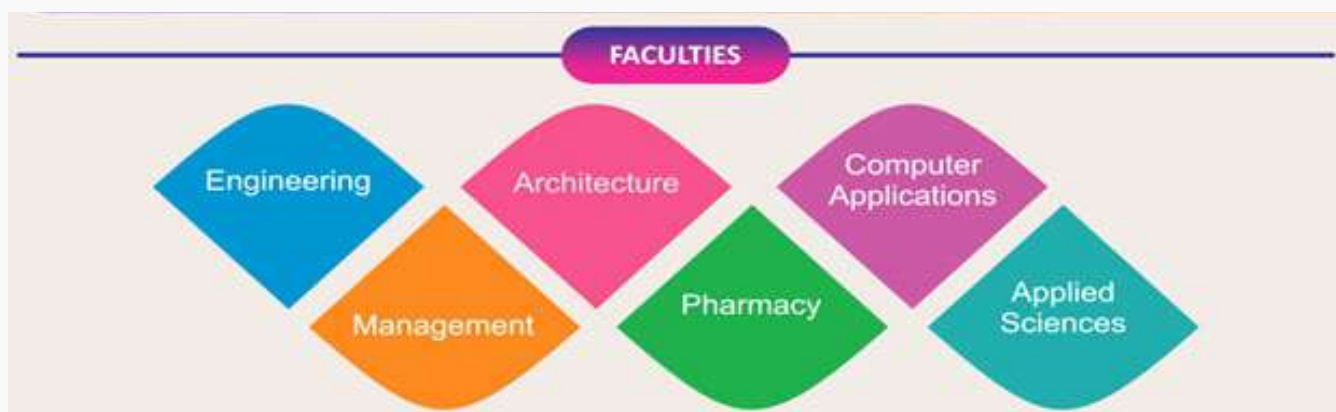

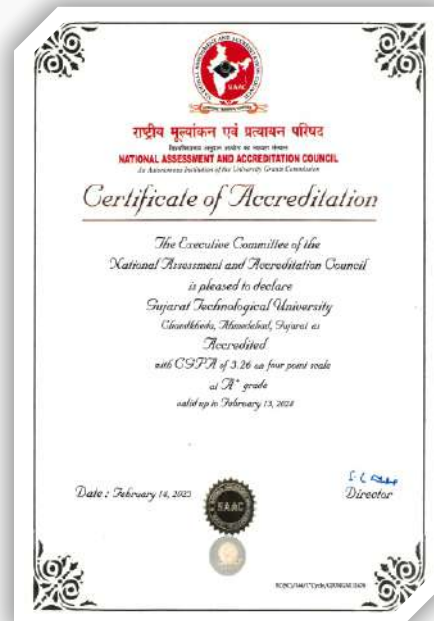

University gives Endorsement to the Principal and teaching faculties of SFI & Granted institution as per the concerned apex body norms and regulations.

- In this Academic Year, **12** new institutes were affiliated with GTU.

STUDENT SUPPORT SECTION

Student Support Section (SSS) works as a centralized system to support the students of the university. We are providing guidance, services, and assistance to the students before and after the completion of the courses. This section works through web based user-friendly procedures, thereby reducing the usage of paper.

Services of the Section through Online Student Portal:

- All services of this section are online through the student portal, and a hard copy of the requested certificates is posted at the student's address.
- Section provides services of Transcript (Soft copy), Transcript (Hard copy), and share Transcript soft copy to WES. Migration, Language, Attempt and Rank Certificate, Percentage certificate, Attestation of GTU grade-sheets, Provisional Certificates, Degree/Diploma Final Certificates, Duplicate Degree/Diploma Certificates, Duplicate/Name Correction Grade-sheets and other misc. certificates are also provided as per the requests of the students.
- The students can apply from any zone (Ahmedabad Zone-1, Rajkot Zone-4 & Surat Zone -5), make online payment and get the receipt after log-in at: www.student.gtu.ac.in.
- Once the online payment is successfully made and receipt of the same is available with the student then he/she will get the certificates/documents by post.
- Students are not required to come in person to collect the documents.

Services of the Section through Students Application form:

- Authentication of Original Degree/Diploma certificates.
- To issue special certificates like Percentage certificate for non-pass out (Navy/Army), Bonafide certificates, Semester-wise SPI to Percentage, Total marks certificate and any other misc. certificates as per students' request.
- GTU Student Academic Document Verification through e-mail & Hard copy from company /Institute /3rd party organization.
- Section also handles all duties related to distribution of degree & diploma certificates before and after completion of the convocation ceremony.

Innovative Practice of the section:

- This section has also prepared and uploaded the tutorial videos of various procedures at the GTU official YouTube channel as well as on the GTU website.
- Shares an electronic Transcript with WES without charges.
- Sends authentic students documents from the university through email to other universities or institutes, as requested by the students.
- This section has also prepared and uploaded the User Manual and SOPs for Student Support Section Services on the GTU website, for the benefit of the students.

Statistical data of Student Support Section work per month:

- This Section processes & dispatched approximately **6357** certificates related to student Transcript (Hard copy), Transcript (Hard copy + Soft copy), Migration, Language, Attempt and Rank Certificate and Percentage certificate through student portal.
- Around **434** applications were processed for "Sends authentic student's documents from the university through email to other universities".
- Around **470** online electronic transcripts were successfully shared to WES for further processing as per student request.
- Around **3071** Transcripts (soft copy) were shared to students' email id from GTU.

- Around **58695** Degree Diploma certificates were dispatched through post/hand to hand by Student support section in this year.
- Around **428** applications processed for Credential Evaluation Form (WES, GES, NCESS, IQAS, ICESS), attestation of Grade-sheets, degree and provisional certificates.

Establishment section of Gujarat Technological University looks after all the activities during the whole span of services of Regular Employees, Contractual Employees and Outsourced Employee i.e. from Recruitment to Retirement.

University has a very young & dynamic workforce.

- University has framed policy for the contractual employees to govern their employment. For the social security purpose, university reimburses the premium of different Government social security schemes i.e. 'Atal Pension Yojana', 'Pradhan Mantri Surksha Bima Yojana', and 'Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojna' to employees.
- Under the Atal Pension Yojana, guaranteed minimum pension of Rs. 1,000/- or 2,000/- or 3,000/- or 4,000 or 5,000/- per month will be given at the age of 60 years depending on the contributions by the subscribers.
- Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana is a government scheme which intends to provide an affordable insurance scheme for the poor and underprivileged people in the age group of 18 to 70 years with a bank account at a premium of Rs.12 per annum; risk coverage of Rs.2 lakh for accidental death and full disability and Rs.1 lakh for partial disability.
- The Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana provides life coverage to the poor and low-income section of the society. The scheme offers a maximum assured amount of Rs.2 lakhs.
- University has also taken Medical Insurance of Rs. 3 lakh coverage for its contractual Employees.
- University is providing the Crèche facility to the children of the employees. University Crèche Centre has two dedicated lady caretakers.
- University has appointed one male and one female doctor. Dispensary facilities are available for the employees and their family members.
- University also has a 'SAMVAD Center' where social, psychological, and emotional needs of the staff members are taken care of with various awareness programs. The centre caters to diverse mental health needs of individuals of all ages and groups where they are assisted in clarifying the issues, exploring options, developing strategies and increasing self-awareness.

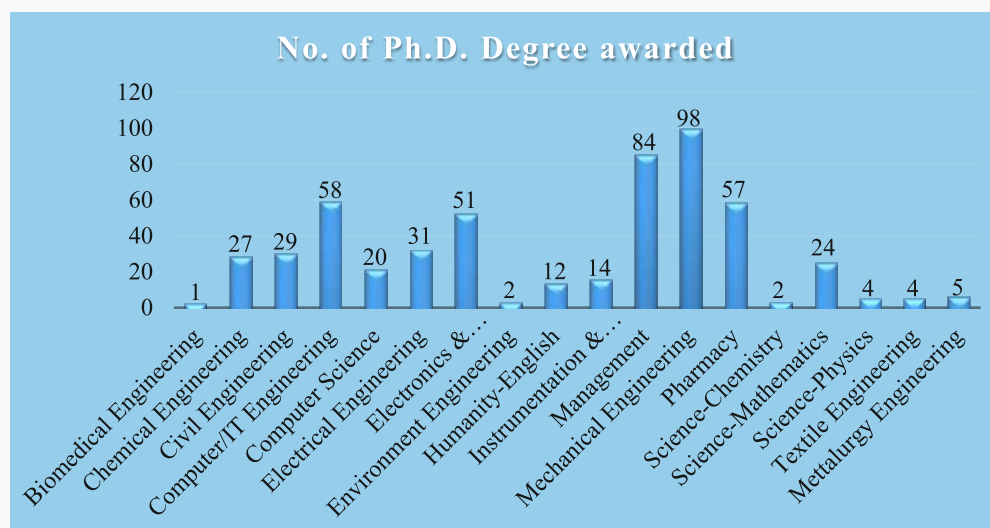

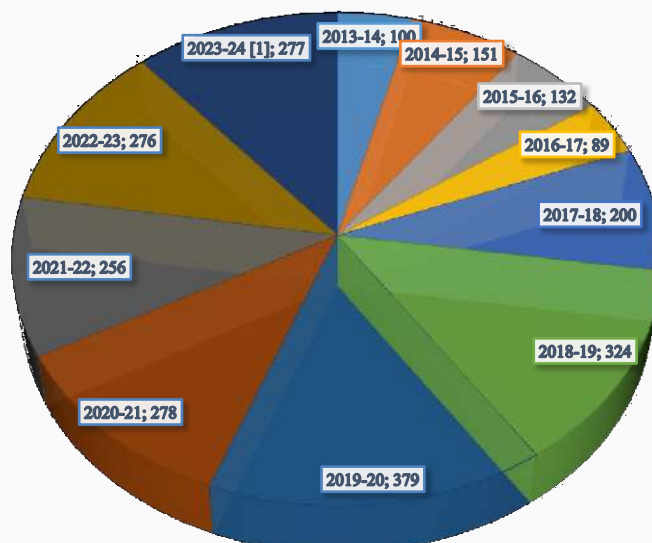

1) No. of Ph.D. Degree awarded till date in various disciplines till 30/11/2023

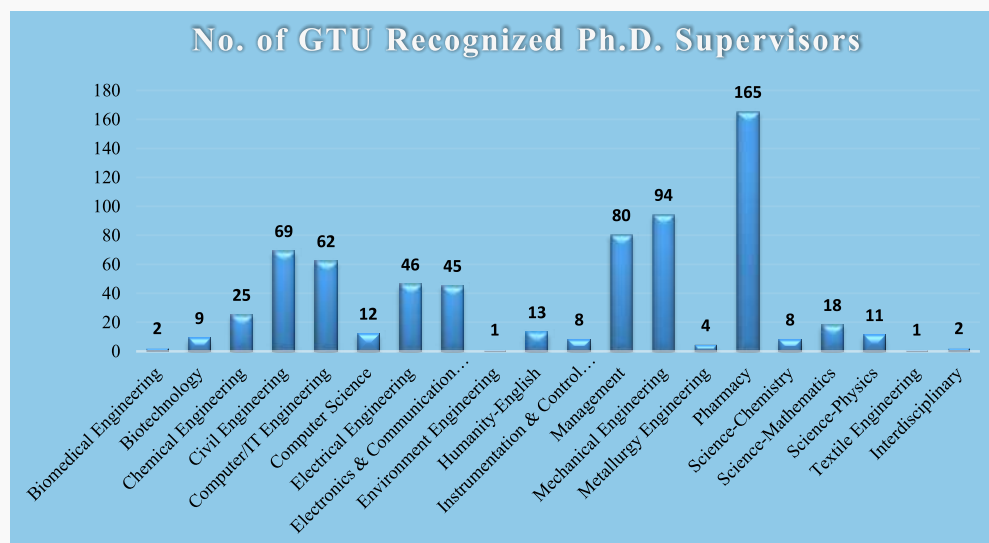


2) Enrolment of Research Scholars in Ph.D. Programme (year-wise)

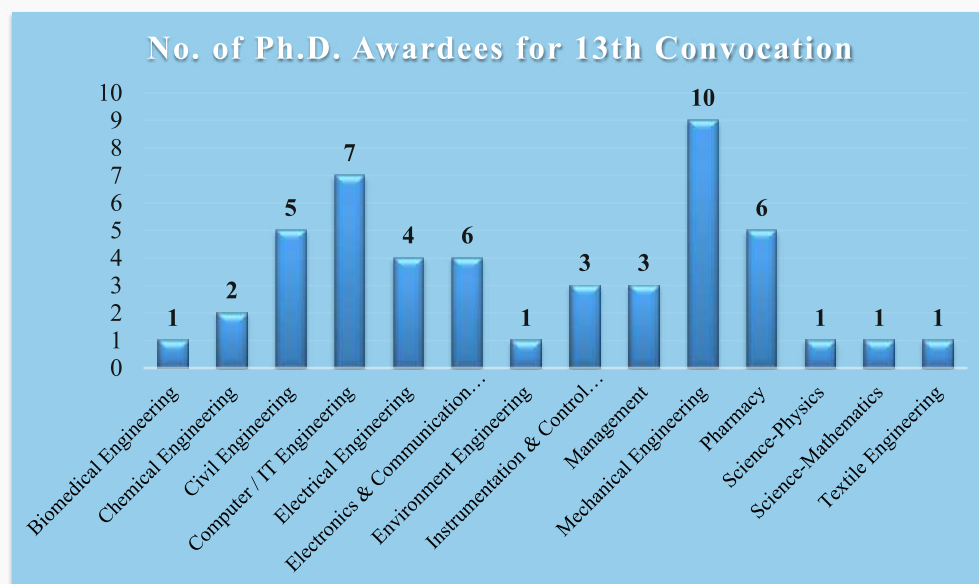
NO. OF RESEARCH SCHOLARS ENROLLED (YEAR-WISE)

GTU provided an opportunity for BE final year students for developing projects as part of an internship of 12 weeks at the section. The interns were selected based on merit and after conducting a technical exam. These interns were given the tasks of software development that will be used at the university.

This section manages basic records, exam records, results and projects data of all the students since inception of the university.

The GTU-IT policy comprises standard operating procedure for hardware & software installation, use of network (intranet & internet), firewall, e-mail and database access & backup, result processing system, software development and maintenance system. It also includes the guidelines for computer naming conventions and hosting web pages on intranet/ internet.

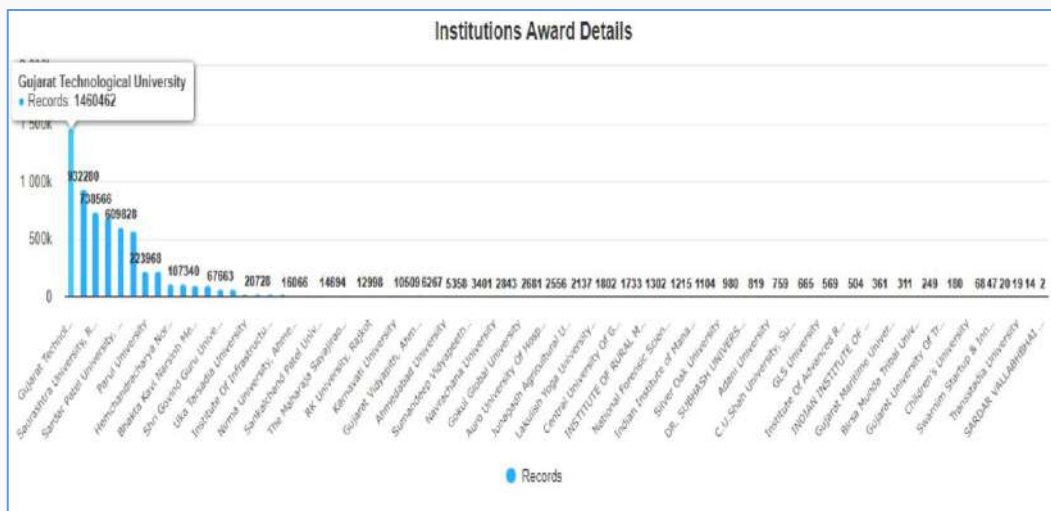


Figure 2: Highest Number of Records Uploaded on DigiLocker

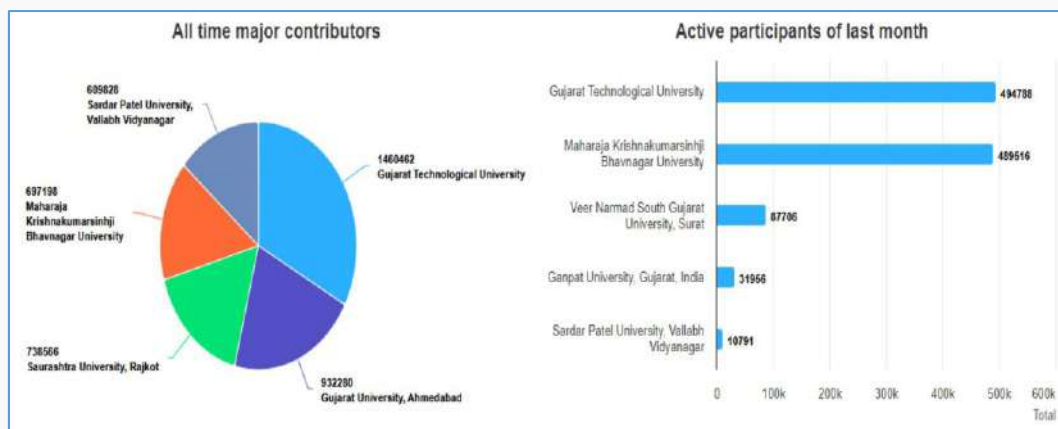


Figure 3: Statistics about Data Uploaded on DigiLocker as on 5th October, 2023

The degree certificates of all the students have been uploaded on DigiLocker. The uploading of marksheet data and ABC IDs is progressively being carried out on DigiLocker portal. GTU is at the top position as far as the number of degree certificates and marksheet data are uploaded on DigiLocker as per the graphical data from DigiLocker shown in Figure 2 & 3.

The Internal Audit section started in October 2013 and since then it works as a constructive arm of the university. The Internal Audit section works as a team continuously towards achieving the objectives of the university by following principles of Integrity, Objectivity, Competence, Due Care, Confidentiality and Professional Skepticism.

Main objectives and areas of conducting internal audit are:

- To be a person of highest integrity and maintain utmost confidentiality of all information acquired during the audit work.
- Being moral and ethically responsible. All conflicts of interest are avoided and not to seek or derive any undue personal benefit or advantage from our own position.
- While gathering, evaluating and reporting of the facts & evidence, work is carried out in a highly objective manner without any prejudice or undue influences/ pressure/ interference.
- Exercise due professional care and diligence while carrying out the internal audit i.e., exercises reasonable care in carrying out the work to ensure the achievement of planned objectives.
- An attitude that includes a questioning mind, being alert to conditions, which may indicate possible misstatement due to error or fraud.

Although, internal auditor must be an independent person, it is responsible to the management of the university. **Internal audit is done to continuously improve the internal financial control system adopted by the university.**

The team of the Internal Audit section verifies on an average 80 files/documents/vouchers etc. daily. Queries/remarks/observation are resolved with conciliation/ discussion/ instruction as and when required and includes verification of expenses to ensure compliance of all the rules/regulations/circulars/notifications etc. and ensures the implementation of the prescribed procedures and the orders issued from time to time.

ESTATE SECTION

The major role of the Estate section is to develop infrastructure facilities and maintain the property of the University. Government of Gujarat allotted 100 acres land at Village- Lekawada, Dist. Gandhinagar to develop the new campus of Gujarat Technological University. The master planning of the new campus is designed by a well-known architectural consultant “INI Design Studio Pvt. Ltd., Ahmedabad”. The total estimated cost for development of the whole campus approved by the Gujarat Government is of Rs. 486.00 Cr. The campus will be developed in a phase wise manner. Total 17 buildings like administrative building, Academic buildings, Hostels, Residential buildings, Library, Animal House, Cafeteria and common facilities like Post office, Bank extension counters, Stationery, Healthcare etc. will be constructed in 1st Phase of work. The construction cost for the 1st phase is Rs. 275.00 Cr for the built up area of 64572 Sq. mt and construction of most of the buildings is currently underway.

This new campus will be constructed as per the standards of world class University with green building concept and following norms for GRIHA/IGBC rating. New campus includes IBMS (Intelligent Building Management System), Rooftop Photovoltaic Solar Electricity Generation System, HVAC, Water Distribution System including storage & treatment plant, Rain Water Harvesting System, and Solid Waste Management system. Sewage water will be treated & used for horticulture & flushing. This new campus will have concrete paved internal roads, Walkways, Cycle Paths, Barrier free environment for the persons with disabilities, Landscaping, Afforestation & Horticulture etc.

EXAMINATION SECTION

GTU Exams at a Glance

Gujarat Technological University has taken many initiatives to position itself as a global university by adapting innovative approaches for the benefit of students and faculties. This has been possible because of the entire support and positive attitude of all affiliated colleges, principals, and faculty members. To make the examination system more reliable, transparent, and accountable, GTU has adopted many innovative approaches.

A total of 13795 manuscript preparation appointment orders for setting up question papers for various subjects were issued for the Winter-2022 and Summer-2023 examinations. A total of 7030 number of different subjects were offered in the Winter-2022 and Summer-2023 examinations. A total of 392126 students had registered in 33 different courses for the Winter-2022 and Summer-2023 examinations.

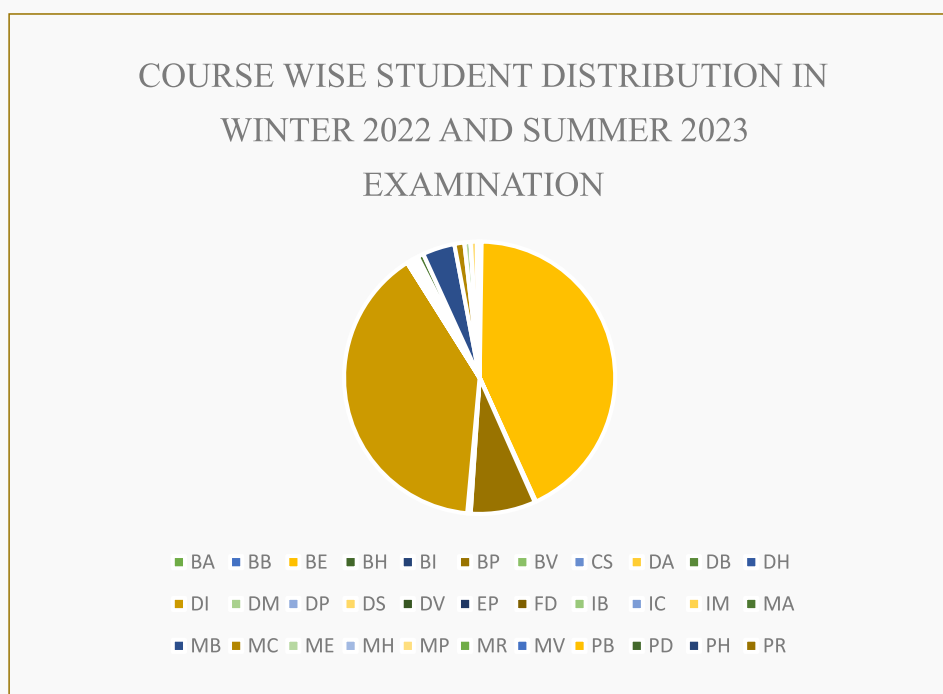

Examination Process and Set-up

To make the examination process smoother, the university has divided the whole state into six zones, namely Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, Vallabh Vidyanagar, Rajkot, Surat, and Bhuj. Zonal officers are deputed during exams in these zones. The university appoints faculties of affiliated colleges as GTU observers in each exam centre for smooth conduct of exams, and answer books are transferred to the concerned zonal office on the same day of the exam by the observer after completion of exams. The observer has to reach the exam center at least 50 minutes before the commencement of the subject exam.

During any university subject exam, a student is given a student-specific and subject-specific barcode, which is to be pasted by the student on his/her answer book. At the end of the subject exam, the student is required to hide his/her identity i.e., seat number, student's signature, junior supervisor's name, and signature by pasting a hollow brown sticker.

Assessment of Students Answer-Books

Answer books are assessed through E-assessment in the Summer-2023 examination, and manual assessment was carried out in the Winter-2022 examination. Answer books are collected on the very same day as soon as the examinations for the day/session are over from all the colleges located in any of the six zones. All such answer books collected for the day are shuffled subject-wise, bundled, and packed in a bunch of 100 answer books. By the next day, these bundles are transported to the university head office located in Chandkheda, Ahmedabad.

Manual Assessment of Hard-copy of Student's Answer books

Lots received at GTU, Chandkheda, from different zonal offices are shuffled and assigned examiners for evaluation. The said lots are transported back to the concerned Zonal Office. From Zone Office, these unassessed answer book lots are transported to the college of the concerned examiner.

Faculties at colleges collect this answer book lot from the GTU coordinator of the college, and keep it in their custody till the assessment is over. Once the assessment is over, evaluator enters marks online through a secure portal and submit assessed answer book lots to the GTU coordinator.

At the university, these assessed lot bundles having maximum of 100 answer books are opened to re-enter and validate question-wise marks as well as total marks. Entered marks are verified again by entering total marks. Any error related to the entry that might have occurred at the examiner level is rectified here. After mark entry, answer books are again packed in a bag and stored at a definite location.

E-Assessment

The E-Assessment system was introduced from the term-end external theory examination of MBA Semester-1 in the Winter-2012 as a pilot project. Based on the success, the 'E-Assessment' was later implemented in other courses as well.

In e-assessment, digital answer book is uploaded to a portal through which examiners can securely assess the answer book online, and digital access to the assessed answer book is given to the students, which enables transparency in the examination system. The allotment of answer books to the available evaluators is done randomly. Evaluators can carry out e-assessments using computers/laptops and internet connectivity from anywhere at any time, thus giving them freedom of assessment as per their convenience using technology. Approximate 24 million answer books have been digitally evaluated by GTU up until now since the Winter-2012 examination.

When students apply for re-assessment, the digital scan copy is again published to be evaluated by another examiner. If a student applies for online viewing of his/her answer-book, then the answer book is displayed in the concerned student's portal login.

Secure Online Question Paper Delivery System (SOQPDS)

University has transmitted a large number of Question Papers in Theory Examinations to different exam centres located across the state through Secure Online Question Paper Delivery System (SOQPDS). University has transmitted 3463 Subject's Question Papers to 405 exam centres in Winter 2022 Examination and in Summer 2023 Examination 3567 Subject's Question Papers were transmitted to 349 Exam Centres.

Entry of Marks and Result Preparation

Gujarat Technological University has developed online portals for fetching marks of various components of student's result.

* For an External Theory Examination, there are two modes of evaluation, i.e., e-assessment and manual evaluation of hard copies of the student's answer-book. For manual evaluation, marks entered by the paper evaluator are entered again and revalidated at the university level to remove any type of entry-related error.

Reforms

To eliminate the possibility of leakage or any other such discrepancy about question papers, the university has introduced innovative strategies for better management of examinations. The university has implemented the Secure Online Question Paper Delivery System (SOQPDS), which incorporates various security features from the Summer-2018 examination. The university is transmitting question papers to exam centers, which are located across the state. The encrypted compact disk is replaced by SOQPDS. The examination process using the e-system has proven to be the most reliable and confidential system and is appreciated all over.

A new question paper style for the B.E. new syllabus based on Course Outcome (CO) and Cognitive Level (as per Revised Bloom's Taxonomy) is implemented from the academic year 2018-19. The university has achieved success in delivering grade cards to colleges through Speed Post in a short time after the declaration of results, so that grade cards can be received by students in a timely manner. Cash less GTU Exam administration for students as well as college payment. The online portal for the exam stationary has been activated from the Winter-2018 examinations. Speedy digital payment for the drawing of manuscripts was implemented from the Winter-2018 exams. Appointment of paper setters are done through a panel comprising of Deans, Associate Deans, Chairman, and Members of BOS.

Appreciation by peers

Gujarat Technological University earned fame for having a very robust system for conducting examinations. Various universities visit the Gujarat Technological University campus to explore the possibility of adopting the best practices of GTU examination system. The exam section has got the opportunity to share knowledge and experience on a mutual basis with officers of many other universities. Other university officers, including core members of the Examination Department, Computer Department, and General Administrators like the Registrar, Controller of Examination, Deputy Registrar, Assistant Registrar, System Analyst, and Programmers, have visited the university. They have studied our system and appreciated the modern approaches adopted by GTU.

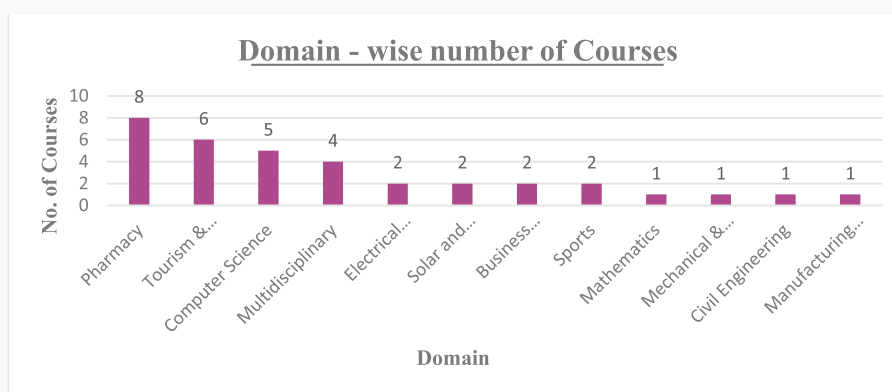


Figure 1: Domain-wise number of courses completed till October-2023

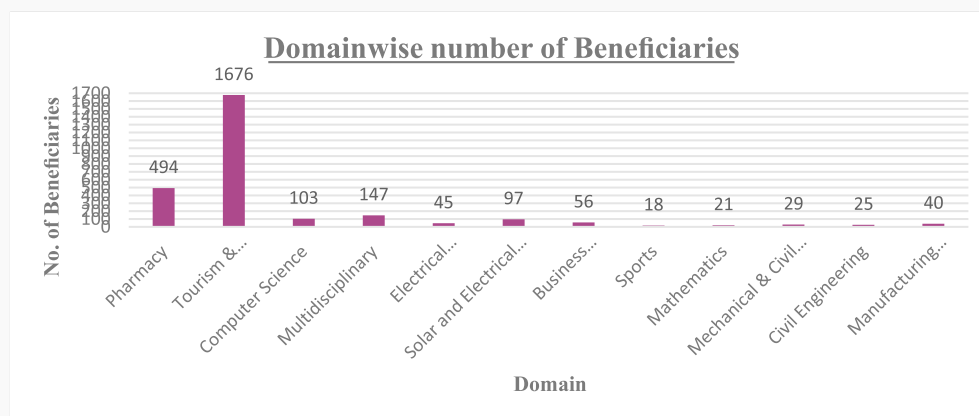


Figure 2: Domain-wise number of beneficiaries through completed courses till October-2023

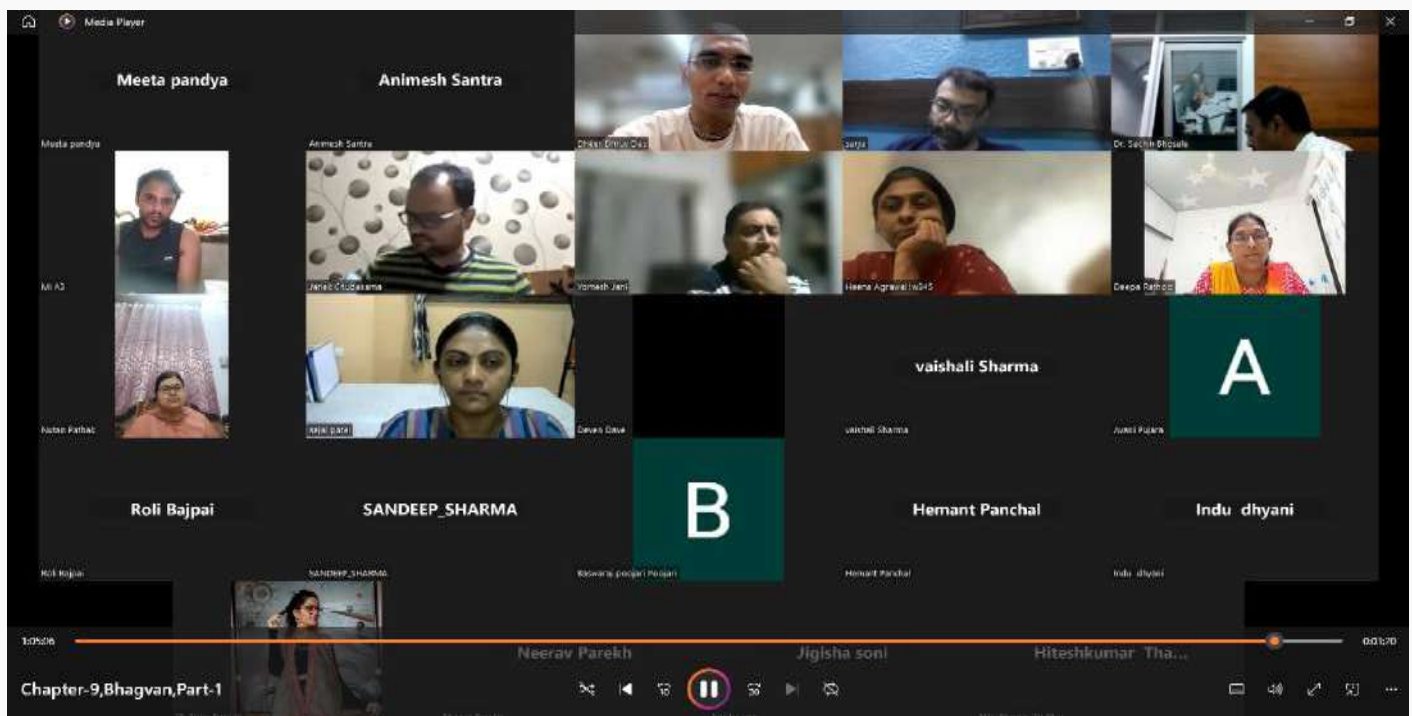

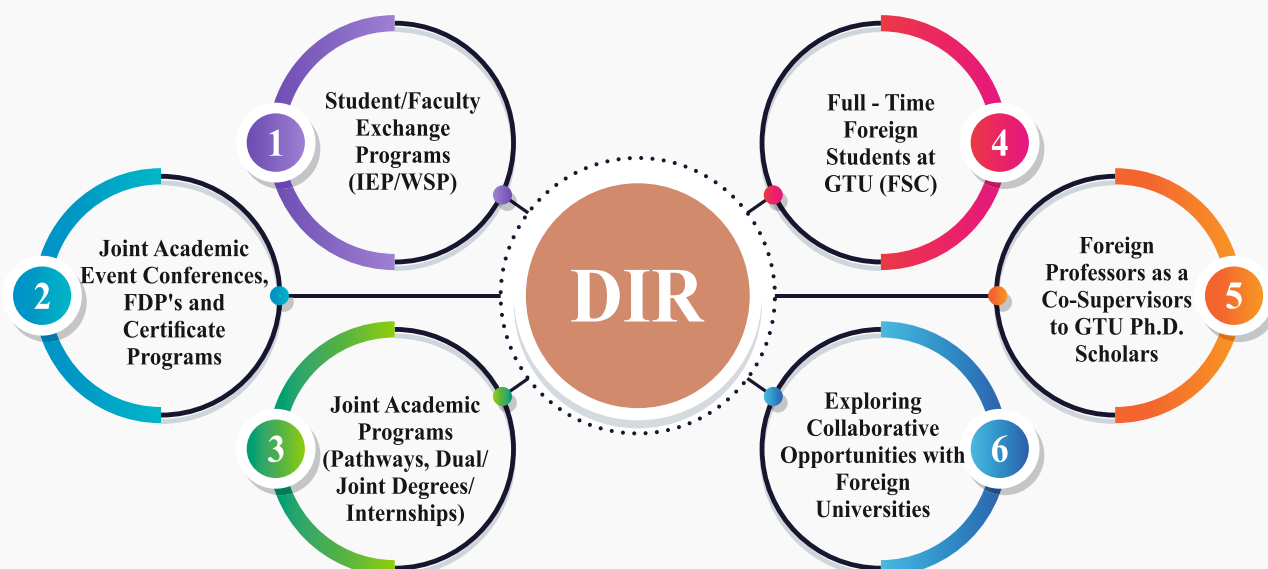

• FOREIGN STUDENTS' CELL

Foreign Students' Cell was established in 2013. The major activities of FSC are the administration of admission, academic progress, and other relevant requirements of foreign students at GTU

From 2013 to 2023, GTU has admitted 1152 foreign students from 66 countries of the world. The presence of such a large number of foreign students from more than sixty countries of the world brings a high level of cross-cultural environment in the classrooms and makes *GTU a truly international university*.

• Admission of Foreign Students (A.Y. 2023 – 24):

In the current academic year, GTU has received around 2500 applications through ICCR for admission into various courses offered by GTU. Out of these applications, 112 foreign students from 27 countries have been given admission in A.Y. 2023-24 at various affiliated institutes at GTU & GTU PG schools.

This Council and Centre helps to create a culture of innovation and aids in new product augmentation. GTU Innovation Council has taken strategic steps to establish a close and continued interaction with the students spanning across various domains through its various activities and developing an entrepreneurial mind-set.

GTU Innovation Council is cultivating a multi-layered innovation ecosystem, pioneering more than 12 initiatives spanning across 8 sectors. Intellectual Property Felicitation Centre (IPFC)

Intellectual Property Right (IPR) and in particular Patent plays a key role in the current knowledge based economy of any country. GTU – IPFC has launched different courses in IPR and has established a WIPO-TISC centre at the university in agreement with CIPAM to stimulate a dynamic, vibrant and balanced intellectual property right system in the state/nation. GTU is the seventh CIPAM-DPIIT approved centre. GTU is the first university in the state to set-up a Technology and Innovation Support Centre (TISC).

More than 3500 students had participated in the IPR workshops, held at various GISC across the state. 417 projects from different technical fields were screened by the university's IP Screening Committee out of which 169 projects got selected and were found eligible for financial assistance under university's IPR guidelines.

GTU-Intellectual Property Facilitation Centre (GTU-IPFC) provides free access to a paid Patent Database, which was accessed by 1752 beneficiaries to study patent literature in their respective technical fields for focused research in the particular domain.

At present 7th batch of PGDIPR course is in progress. 15 students have qualified the Patent Agent Exam of India from the previous enrolled batches and are currently serving in reputed organizations.

- IPFC offers PGDIPR programme:** PGDIPR is an off campus program with 120 hours of contact classes. In this programme we teach Chinese Patent System, ARIPO Patent System and Case study based learning along with Indian Patent Agent Exam Module.
- WIPO - Technology Innovation Support Center (WIPO – TISC):** - GTU has established a Technology and Innovation Support Centre (TISC) for IPR Promotion and Management in collaboration with CIPAM, under Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce and Industry (MCI), Govt. of India and World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO). This Technology and Innovation Support Centre (TISC) program provides innovators access to locally based, high quality technology information and related services, helping them to exploit their innovative potential and to create, protect, and manage their intellectual property (IP) rights.
- IP Chair:** The Ministry of Commerce and Industry has given its official approval to establish an IP Chair at the university. GTU is among the selected institutions chosen for the IPR Chair under the SPRIHA scheme, launched by the Department for Promotion of Industries and Internal Trade (DPIIT). The primary aim of the IPR Chair is to empower founders to develop their own IP management strategy to mitigate risk, create and capture value, and lay the groundwork for sustainable growth to align with the objectives of the nation's IPR policy.

Community Innovation & Co-Creation Centre (CiC3)

Community Innovation and Co-Creation Centre (CiC3) was established to promote the spirit of co-innovation. This centre creates physical and virtual arrangements to enable student innovators to convert their ideas into demonstrable and functional prototypes. Manufacturing, Electronics, ICT are major domains of this Centre. The key facilities and work domains of CiC3 are mentioned below:

1. **Fabrication Laboratory (FABLAB)** - FABLAB is a combination of enabling community and physical space where professionals, students, researchers and innovators get access and also learn to use professional tools. They also meet and collaborate with other individuals in their community.
2. **Rashtriya Avishkar Abhiyan (RAA)** - RAA promotes the spirit of inquiry and creativity. RAA encourages promotion of science and mathematics through effective use of technology and encourages those who show an inclination for these subjects to achieve academic excellence.
3. **IT Infrastructure Abhiyan (ITIA)** - GIC through ITIA has made efforts to build various infrastructures for MSMEs by using technology developed by students to improve their productivity and efficiency.
4. **Co-Creation with ATAL Tinkering Labs**- Atal Innovation Mission under NITI Aayog has set-up ATAL Labs at schools to promote creativity and hands-on learning among students during their early days. AIC-GISC is an approved nodal center to execute the Startup India seed fund scheme and Startup Gujarat seed fund scheme of Govt. of Gujarat to support the Start-ups/Innovation. This year AIC has organized 20+ events to support innovators in the form of training sessions, workshops, acceleration programs, awareness programs & sensitization events. AIC has supported 15 in-house startups having female founders or co-founder. 40+ ideas were incubated with AIC-GISC till date and a start-up has also received an MSME hackathon grant of 15 Lakhs. A MoU has also been signed with the Young Indians Ahmedabad chapter.
5. **ROBOCON** – GTU ROBOCON team comprised of 40 Students, d from various GTU affiliated colleges participated in the Robotics organized every year by Asia Pacific Broadcasting Union for the Asia region and secured 6th rank. This team also won the Sintel Metal ation (SMC) Award for ‘Best Technical Skill’ on 27th Aug 2023. The on Team became National Champion in National DD ROBOCON on 18th June 2023 and received the National Champion Ship Trophy Balakrishna Memorial Award.

6. **‘Mitsubishi Electric Cup’ and ‘GT Motorsports’** are other focus areas on which GTU team works.

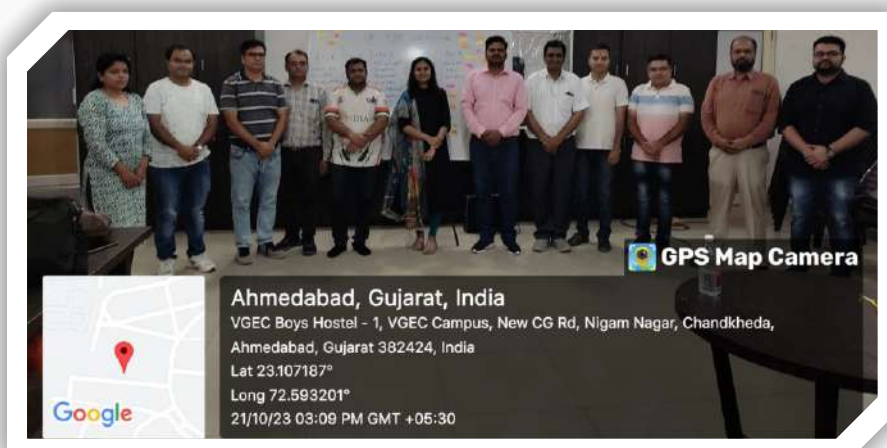
Design Innovation Centre (DIC)

2. **Cultivating a Culture of Design, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship:** DIC aims to foster a culture of design thinking, innovation, and entrepreneurship among young minds in the state. It serves as a hub for promoting these skills and mindsets.

The Design Innovation Centre operates as a HUB at the university premises, with three SPOKE locations at AVPTI College, Rajkot, Dr. S & S. S. Gandhi College of Engineering & Technology, Surat and Government Engineering College, Modasa.

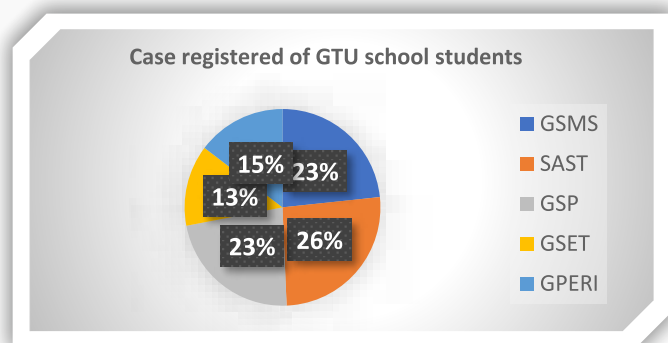
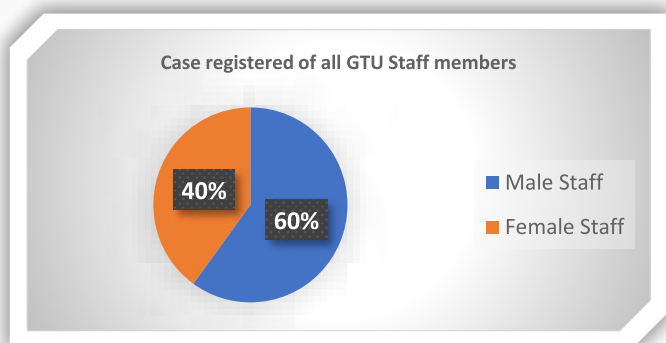

- This center is actively reaching out by visiting colleges within GTU, including GSP Gandhinagar and GPERI Mehsana, every week.
- SAMVAD organized a stress management session for GPERI staff, combining expertise with enjoyable activities to promote a supportive work environment.
- Ms. Yogina Derji was invited for a two-day program at GSP, focusing on *students' "Planning Journey"*, emphasizing time management, and understanding opportunities in the realm of work life.
- In alignment with contemporary practices, SAMVAD has started *Digitalizing all case records* over the last two years, streamlining access to crucial information. This ensures efficiency and confidentiality.
- SAMVAD conducts programs for GTU students and staff on the *National Telle MANAS* mental health initiative, along with publishing articles on suicide prevention and exam stress awareness in newspapers.
- SAMVAD now offers new therapies like Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), positive therapy, and music therapy, which are helpful for issues like anxiety, depression, OCD, and panic disorder.
- SAMVAD center arranges weekly sessions for various schools in GTU, discussing topics like stress, depression, communication, suicide, and addiction to promote psychological well-being.
- SAMVAD has conducted over 160 Personality Assessments on students, enhancing their personality development and providing valuable insights for career counseling.
- Stress management is a key focus for SAMVAD, with over 1350 Stress Meter assessments conducted across GTU, offering valuable insights into stress levels within the university community.

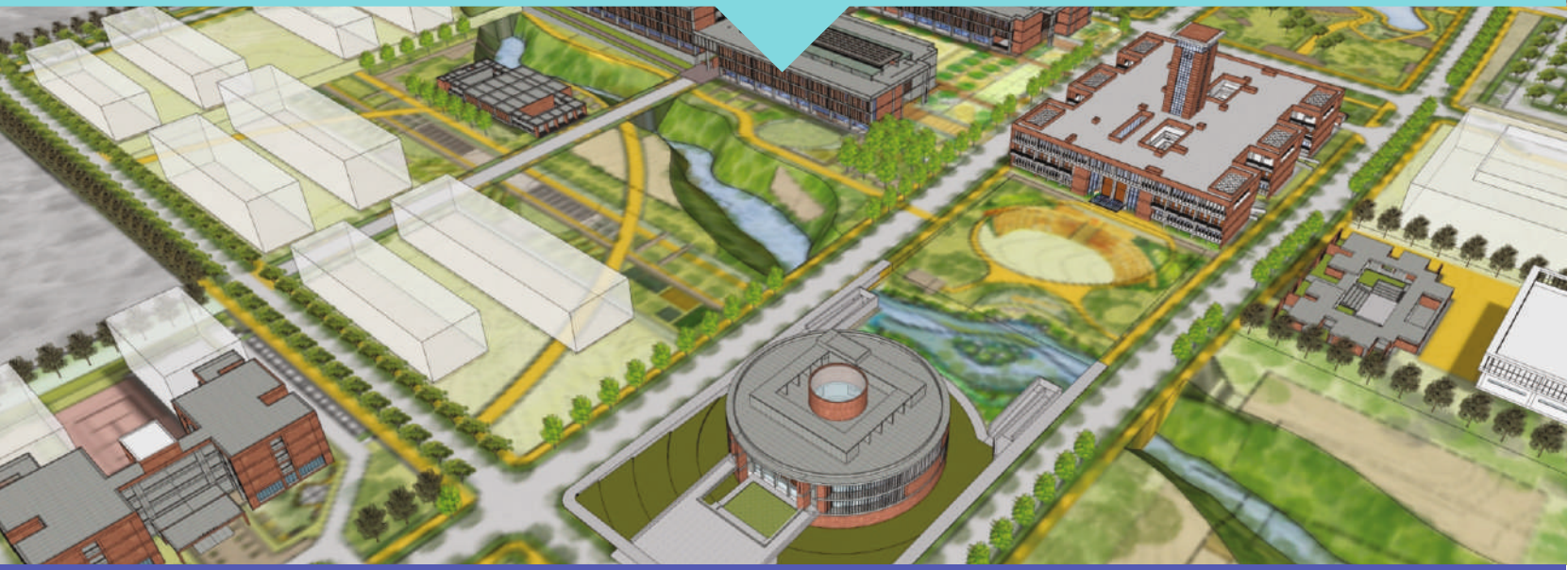
